

CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

1. *Taiwan Journal of Theology* is a peer-reviewed annual journal devoted to academic research in theology. It publishes scholarly articles and lectures in Systematic Theology, Biblical Studies, Church History, Practical Theology, Ecumenical Studies, Contextual Theology, Religious Studies, Religious Education, Church and Society, Liturgy, and Church Music.
2. The central theme of Issue 53 (2026) is: **“The 490th Anniversary of the First Edition of John Calvin’s *Institutes of the Christian Religion*.”** Submissions related to Calvin’s theology and the *Institutes* are particularly welcome. Articles on other theological topics will also be considered.
3. Articles may be written in Chinese or English. They should be clearly written using good form and style. The length of a research article should be 8000–14000 words (not including footnotes) in Chinese, or 5000–10000 words (including footnotes) in English, and 1000–3000 words for a book review. Manuscripts preferably Word.doc and, including an abstract of approximately 500 words in Chinese and 200 words in English, and 5 keywords. Each author should also include his or her name in both Chinese and English and academic affiliation (seminary, college, university, etc.).
4. This journal adopts a double-blind peer review process. Manuscripts should not contain any identifying information related to the author. Author information should be provided on a separate cover page.
5. Manuscripts will be reviewed by the Journal’s editorial committee and other qualified scholars. The editorial committee reserves the right to request revisions or to reject any submission deemed inappropriate for publication. If an article is accepted for publication the author will receive three free copies of the journal.
6. The authors of any submissions to this Journal hereby acknowledge and agree that any submission accepted by the *Taiwan Journal of Theology* and published in this Journal shall be included in the READncl Remote Electronic Access/Delivery system of the National Central Library (“READncl System”) and any other database otherwise chosen by the *Taiwan Journal of Theology*. The submissions may be digitally preserved, duplicated, transmitted publicly by internet, downloaded, and printed by authorized users. In addition, the format of submissions may be changed in order to meet the requirements of the READncl System or other databases.
7. To uphold academic integrity and publication standards, contributors are encouraged to use plagiarism detection software prior to submission.
